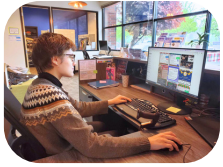


# A WAY HOME WASHINGTON

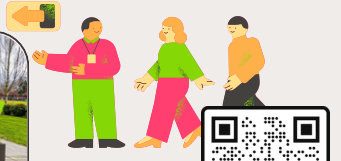

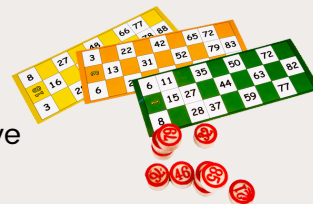

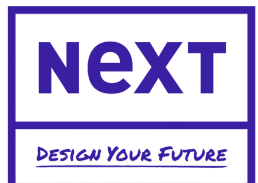
